CCC Volunteers Protect Kulsary Residents from Potential Flooding–Kazakhstan

It took 10 days, 18 CCC employees and 376 hours of their effort and volunteered time to build and install dikes along the edge of the four kilometer long Kamyskol Lake to prevent it from overflowing and flooding the land and houses of the residents of Kulsary. Every year in March, layers of accumulated snow melts and causes massive flooding endangering hundreds of the residents living around the lake. Upon hakimat's request, CCC engineers, surveyors, logistics, laborers, foremen mobilized and came together to address the recurring flooding issue and protect Kulsary's community.

Joining CCC's Volunteering Program as an Arabic translator at Doctors of the World gave me the opportunity to work with refugee families coming from war zones such as Syria and Iraq, who had to escape conflict and to risk their lives to bring their children to safety. I attended medical examination sessions at different clinics to help Arabic-speaking patients communicate with doctors including pediatricians, gynecologists and Orthopedics. Among those were patients who had gone through traumatic conditions and were under high stress, single parents, elderly and unaccompanied people who had to struggle to understand their medical conditions and to overcome all the new and unfamiliar life challenges.

This experience taught me the importance of supporting others throughout their hospital visits and recovery process especially when it comes to sensitive and critical medical conditions; as every minor thing we offer no matter how simple it is, such as guiding the patient through the procedures, supporting them emotionally, comforting them and letting them feel that they are not facing the problem alone, could be highly valued in the eye of the patient. I have also learned to accommodate to each patient's specific condition for example by showing patience and repeating the treatment instructions until the patient completely understands the process and by paying extra attention to the details and recommendations advised by doctors and communicating them accurately to the patients.

I thank the doctors and staff of Doctors of the World for welcoming me into their team and for appreciating my service and letting me sense the value and importance of my job there.

A Day of Learning and Giving at the Innovative Park of Earth Organization - Greece

On October 11, 13 of Athens based volunteers and members of their families visited Organization Earth to learn, give and contribute to a sustainable way of living at the Organization's "Center of the Earth" 25 acre environmental park. The Center proposes a new way of interface between the economy, society and the environment, making it a living example of a sustainable way of thinking for a healthy, viable planet. The volunteers cooked 200 healthy meals for socially deprived persons and refugees. They learned a few farming techniques; how to crop plants, prune trees and edgings, and planted seasonal vegetables in the Park's vegetable garden. The group also visited the Center's composting lab where they learned how to make organic fertilizers from food waste, and how to grow healthy plants without using agrochemicals.

"I had a great experience because it was not just volunteering work to help those in need but it was educational as well. Being exposed to the methods for planting and decomposing the trash to help the environment is becoming essential in our daily life."
