Children Christmas Drive in Athens

In Cooperation with the Department of Coordination, Employment and Social Protection, and the Balykshy Society of the Disabled in Atyrau region, volunteers identified 100 children with disabilities, bought and provided them with toys, and sweets as New Year gifts. On another effort, the volunteers in coordination with the Society of the Blind, provided toys and candy to 70 children with disabilities and of the most socially vulnerable segments of Atyrau.

Volunteering with children is incredibly rewarding knowing that the contributed effort can make such a big difference to children's lives.

Covid-19 Initiatives

CCC Co-Finances the Construction of Hospital in Kazakhstan

In the city of Kulsary in Atyrau region, CCC is co-financing the construction of an infectious disease hospital. A new 200-bed modular infectious diseases hospital complex will be put into operation, including a medical hospital, a modular oxygen station, a morgue, a laundry room, a canteen, and a 100-bed dormitory.

The new hospital will provide medical care to residents of the Zhylyoi district, as well as to all Tengiz field employees who had to be transported 400km from Tengiz to Atyrau to receive necessary treatment. The support provided during the spread of COVID-19 couldn't have been more well-timed.





CCC in Kazakhstan Continues to Support Local Hospitals

To support local hospitals in dealing with Covid-19 in the Atyrau region of Kazakhstan, CCC was one of 4 other oil service companies (Neftestroy Service Ltd, Consortium ISKER, Montazhspetsstroy, and Real Construction) who donated funds KZT 117 million for the purchase of ten sets of German-made ventilators.





We don't have to be Doctors to Save Lives Blood Drives in Qatar and Oman

To address the challenges that hospitals are facing during the Covid-19 pandemic, CSR in Oman and Qatar organized blood donation drives. In Qatar, the drive was held with the main provider of healthcare, the Hamad Medical Corporation where more than 67 employees contributed more than 67 liters of blood units. In Oman, the blood drive was organized with the Ministry of Health and 59 employees donated 29.5 liters of blood which went to support local blood banks experiencing shortages due to the COVID19 pandemic.
