



Celebration of CCC Volunteers on International Volunteer Day A Year filled with Giving and Goodness



International Volunteer Day on 5 December was designated by the United Nations in 1985 as the international day to celebrate the significance and potential of volunteerism. CCC has chosen this day every year to recognize, appreciate and thank its volunteers in various areas of operation for all their efforts and contributions to helping those in need. In Greece, Egypt, Saudi Arabia, Kazakhstan, and the UAE, celebratory events were held for volunteers, where they received small tokens of gratitude and certificates of appreciation.

In Greece, the first prize went to Zahida Khanum, the second prize went to Nabil Najjar, and the 3rd Prize went to Naim Trabelsi. All three employees volunteered with various NGOs in various tasks, including managing commodities, mentoring youth, and translating organization program documents. During the online Celebration event in Athens, the Chairman of CCC, **Mr. Samer Khoury, acknowledged the volunteers' efforts and hoped that the culture of volunteerism at CCC will continue to flourish in the coming years.**





Since the establishment of CCC's Volunteering Program, CSR has recruited more than 1,500 volunteers who have so far helped more than 400,000 people in Qatar, Kazakhstan, Saudi Arabia, Egypt, Greece, Oman, Lebanon, Mozambique, Botswana, and Algeria. In her keynote speech, CCC CSR Consultant; Rosie Nasser addressed the volunteers by saying: "You are indeed the reason for the continuous success of the Volunteering Program at CCC and the driving force behind CSR's mission to improve people's living conditions. A million thanks to all CCC's volunteers; we couldn't have made it without you." Ms. Nasser thanked the CSR Coordinators' efforts in all CCC's areas of operation, saying: "that they, too, have voluntary positions. Without them, we couldn't have helped so many people."

Empowerment for Palestinian Youth

In December, CCC's Corporate Social Responsibility Department and INJAZ AI-Arab launched the "Start-Ups and Work Readiness" for Palestinian Youth program, which will be delivered through INJAZ AI-Arab's Member Nation INJAZ Palestine. The six-month program will target 150 High school and university students to empower and ignite a unique business and entrepreneurship mindset in them and increase their interest in starting a business.

Through the program, students will experience the full cycle of setting up and running their own enterprise through a dynamic 12-week business simulation program which will focus on how to establish a start-up while providing a complementary focus on contemporary issues, research, and analysis, communication, organization, and business management with the direct engagement of CCC employees who will engage virtually with the students in Palestine. The program will culminate with an exciting national and regional competition for Best Student Company of the Year.



Pro Bono Project Management Training

In November and December of 2022, through CCC's Volunteering Program, Manar Al Shami; CCC's Head of Training, provided training for the staff member of Education for Employment (EFE) on a pro-bono basis. Sixty-three (63) EFE employees from Egypt, Jordan, Morocco, Palestine, Saudi Arabia, Spain, Tunisia, the UAE, and the US attended 2 online training cohorts with two training sessions per cohort.



While the first session on Project Management Essentials outlined the project management framework, project lifecycles, the value delivery system, and project management principles, the second session focused on Project Management Techniques, which included the tools for planning and scheduling, tools for managing risk, and a case study on agile management.

The training was tailored to meet the needs of participating EFE staff and was in line with the latest international best practices and lessons learned in project management. Abbey Walsh, Education and Training Manager from EFE, extended EFE's gratitude for the time and effort put into the training and said: **"The training was well received by our staff as it offered an important professional development opportunity"**. Upon completion, the participants who attended the training received a certificate of completion endorsed by both CCC and the Project Management Institute (PMI) with 2 Professional Development Units (PDUs).

On December 21, CCC employees brought comfort and solace to 100 people living on the street or in very dire conditions by participating in the "Merry Streetmass" initiative organized by CSR in Athens. While some baked cakes and wrapped Christmas gifts, others donated supermarket vouchers and hygienic kits as well as winter clothing accessories. The initiative and volunteering activity was organized with Emfasis; an NGO that addresses the holistic needs of vulnerable and socially excluded people who live deprived of safe housing.







Thanks to Recycling, We Can See Waste as an Opportunity



A total of 696 mattresses of various sizes were donated to the beneficiaries of the Balyksha Society of the Disabled, the World of Disabled Association, and to the public association of Zhurekten-Zhurekke. The three organizations cater to the needs of the disabled, the sick, and low-income families who will benefit from upgrading their mattresses and thus improving their living conditions.

Donating instead of throwing unused furniture and mattresses is a win-win situation whereby the needy who lack the funds to renew their mattresses will receive newer ones, and at the same time, recycling will save energy and will cut back on waste, and more importantly, it conserves our natural resources. CCC volunteers and volunteers from the 3 organizations, delivered the mattresses to the homes of those in need.

CCC Addresses the Needs of Schools and Students on the International Day of Education - Kazakhstan and the UAE

The International Day of Education is an annual international observance day held on January 24 and is dedicated to education as a human right and a public responsibility. This year it was celebrated under the theme "to invest in people, prioritize education". CCC's CSR in Kazakhstan and the UAE celebrated it by addressing the needs of underprivileged and disabled students.


In Kazakhstan, CCC donated 10 computers, 2 printers, network accessories and other equipment to the Kairgali Smagulov Secondary School and Talgairan Primary School located in Kairshakhta: a rural district of Atyrau. The granted equipment made it possible for the two schools to open a new computer class for their 1,840 enrolled students, of which many which many come from low-income families and are orphaned. CCC volunteers from the IT Department assembled and equipped the computers and office equipment, installed them in the classrooms and connected them to the network.

In the UAE, CCC's CSR team chose a day school for children with special needs (the Ability Center for the Handicapped) to engage its employees in giving back to society. While some volunteers repaired and painted some damaged walls of the Center, others decorated the place with balloons and flowers, presented the children with toys and spent the day playing, and entertaining them. In addition, CCC provided the Center with some office furniture and schooling accessories and stationery that will contribute to the Center's mission of providing academic, social growth and development of children with disabilities. The volunteers' efforts were acknowledged by the Center's Manager who presented them with certificates of appreciation.

Quality Education is one of the 17 Sustainable Development Goals of the United Nations, which CCC uses as its guide in developing corporate socially responsible initiatives that aims improve the wellbeing of communities in which it operates.
